Exercise 3A – Understanding Fractions

Demo Question 1:

Color 3 parts out of 4 in a circle.

Solution:

If a circle is divided into 4 equal parts and 3 are shaded, the fraction is $\frac{3}{4}$.

Explanation:

3 = shaded parts (numerator)

4 = total parts (denominator)

Write: $\frac{3}{4}$ of the circle is colored.

Exercise 3B – Proper and Improper Fractions

Demo Question 2:

Write whether these are proper or improper:

(a) $\frac{5}{8}$ (b) $\frac{7}{4}$

Solution:

(a) $\frac{5}{8}$ – Proper fraction (numerator < denominator)

(b) $\frac{7}{4}$ – Improper fraction (numerator > denominator)

Exercise 3C – Comparing Fractions

Demo Question 3:

Compare: $\frac{2}{5}$ and $\frac{3}{5}$

Solution:

Since the denominators are the same, compare numerators:

$2 < 3$, so $\frac{2}{5} < \frac{3}{5}$

Another Example:

Which is greater: $\frac{4}{6}$ or $\frac{2}{6}$?

Answer: $\frac{4}{6} > \frac{2}{6}$

Exercise 3D – Addition & Subtraction of Like Fractions

Demo Question 4 (Addition):

Add: $\frac{1}{6} + \frac{2}{6}$

Add the numerators: $1 + 2 = 3$

Keep the denominator the same: 6

Answer: $\frac{3}{6}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$

Demo Question 5 (Subtraction):

Subtract: $\frac{5}{8} - \frac{2}{8}$

Solution:

$5 - 2 = 3$, so Answer: $\frac{3}{8}$
